Science Resources

Last year we put out a plea for some everyday items that we needed for science investigations. I would like to ask again for some more resources that will help the children's learning during science week and beyond. The key things we need are: Cornflour, bicarb, vinegar, mentos, dried beans, food colouring, pasta, balloons, masking tape, gaffer tape, plastic cups, foil containers, seeds (broad beans, cress, mustard, peas...), compost, iron filings, batteries D and AA. There are also 2 books that we would real like to buy that will aid the teachers science teaching and help them get children thinking, so if anyone was able to donate some money towards these we would really appreciate it. Music lessons

This years theme is "Create, Connect and Share Respect: A better internet starts with you". Please do talk to your children about what they have done on this day and also think about how you keep them safe on the internet. Do remember children should be in shared spaces when on the internet, not in their bedrooms, expect them to ask to go on something and to show you what it is. Social Media is great but you must be aware of the pit falls and talk to your children about these. Most Social Media sites ask for children to be over 12, so think carefully about letting you children use them. Also think about their use of Youtube, there is some fantastic videos on there but you must make sure you have parental controls on and know what they are looking at.
