On-line Safety Day

February 6th was on-line safety day which we celebrate each year as a school. All the children focused on this important area at some point during the day and I wanted to share with you some of their learning, their thoughts and some of the resources we used with them.

Create, Connect and Share Respect A better internet starts with you

This is this year's slogan. In assembly we talked with the children about who they enjoy connecting with on-line, what is suitable on-line behaviour and what is not. The children were clear that they should be polite on-line as they are in real life, ask before sharing a photo or video of someone else, and share any concerns, unkind messages or things that upset them with an adult. You will be glad to know that the children did come up with lots of positive comments and ideas, except having a break from the internet!

Collection from Clubs

Due to our safeguarding policy to keep all children safe ,we would like to ask all parents to wait by the back door and not to come to the front door to come in to watch a club. The back door will be opened when the club has finished for you to collect the children. We are unable to have people in school unless signed in, DBS cleared and have handed their mobile phones to the office as we still have a number of children on site. Please can you keep to this and not put the office in a difficult position by coming to the front.

Mobile Phones

We have a policy of no visitors using their mobile phones on site. Every visitor is asked to leave phones in the office for the duration of their visit. This is to keep the children safe. As parents, please can you not use your phone on site, except for emergencies and certainly not to take photos which may include other children. Of course there are times, like productions when we do allow photos to be taken for personal use but these are through arrangement or discussion. If you particularly want to take a photo in school of your child, ask a member of staff.
