<p>profit: money that is made selling things.</p> <p>prophet: someone who foretells the future.</p>
<p>stationary: not moving.</p> <p>stationery: paper, envelopes, etc</p>
<p>steal: take something that does not belong to you.</p> <p>steel: metal</p>
<p>wary: cautious weary: tired</p>
